- Researchers estimate that 95 percent of all children can be taught to read by the end of first grade.
- Hold schools accountable for every child being taught to read.

What you can do:

- Speak to PTA/PTO organizations, join your school's leadership advisory committee, talk to school board members, and help educate them, make public comments at school board meetings and bring friends.
- Consider charitable giving which provides structured literacy training to school leaders and teachers in need of making the shift.
- Share what you've learned with friends and neighbors.
