State & Local Elected Officials

Relevant facts:

- On both State and National assessments, roughly 65% of Georgia's children cannot read proficiently.
- Researchers estimate that 95% of all children can be taught to read.
- Our business and economy cannot withstand low literacy rates. Bringing high tech industries here demands a highly literate workforce.

What you can do:

- Fund legislation that aims to improve literacy outcomes. In the 2023 session, two bills, SB211 and HB538 consider different ways to approach the problem with a universal goal of using evidence-based practices in schools to improve literacy outcomes.
- Keep apprised of efforts in your district's schools to improve reading outcomes for ALL students.
